Councilmembers, working with many, many citizens, produced a wonderful 4th of July celebration, followed by an equally successful Night Out Against Crime. Thanks to all who contributed their time and efforts to these events and to those who provided support through attendance and participation.

Our community display at the Cache County Fair was outstanding as always and I thank Stephanie Carlsen and those who worked with her into the long hours of several nights for their creativity and imagination. Art requires talent, effort, and vision and Hyrum is blessed with wonderfully creative people.

The Summer Reading Program at the library involved greater numbers of young readers than ever before. Those who feel books are being replaced by devices and technology should witness the excitement and competition of eager readers turning page after page as they explore new worlds and fuel the fires of their imaginations. Thanks to our fine library staff and parents who believe in the magic of quality literature.

As with any government agency, Hyrum City cannot function without staff and support professionals, such as engineers and legal counsel. I'm grateful for our staff and those professionals working with them to solve the problems and challenges of our times as well as build improvements that will serve residents for generations to come. Included on our long list of accomplishments this summer we find ongoing efforts to evaluate and stabilize the hydroelectric dam up Blacksmith Fork Canyon; construction of a 2.0 million gallon culinary water reservoir; a pump station to recycle wastewater effluent into our irrigation system; new restrooms at the canyon campground; new sidewalks near Mountain Crest High School; a new electrical substation and transmission line; two new parks (Salt Hollow and Camp Hollow); a new rodeo arena and a number of other improvement and maintenance projects.

Gerald Miller and a host of volunteers have made impressive progress towards completion of the first phase of Salt Hollow Park and I deeply appreciate the many hours contributed towards this worthy goal. Recent information indicates we may have successfully obtained financial assistance in the form of a grant to help complete Phases II and III of this project as well.

As you can tell, it's been a busy summer for us and we're looking forward to finalizing a number of these projects and then winding down towards the slower pace of winter. Thank you one and all for your support and contributions to our city and for making, as I said, this past season a very special summer.
