MUSEUM NEWS – Our Graduate Student Fellowship Recipient, Samuel Parr has been working for the past year on a new exhibit about the Hyrum Dam and we are excited for its debut on **Saturday, April 12th at 10:00 am** at our monthly workshop. Sam will give a brief presentation on the exhibit and then it will be open for public viewing. Additionally, our student interns Zachary Larsen and Domingos Muala will introduce the public to the new collections of the museum archive. The museum received a generous grant from the Utah State Historical Records Advisory Board and was able to purchase archival materials to properly house our historic documents and photographs. The students processed them into clean, organized, and detailed arrangements that are now available for public research.

During Back in Time this month, Domingos will be teaching about his home country of Mozambique. This children's activity will only be held on **Tuesday, April 15th and Thursday, April 17th** from **2:00-2:30** each day. The children will learn some of the games, customs, and activities that children in Mozambique enjoy.

A NOTE FROM THE CACHE COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE - My name is Deputy Peatross, I am one of the STAR Deputies (Sheriff's Town Area Representative) assigned to Hyrum. In the future through the City newsletter, I hope to keep you posted on programs, resources and contact information for the Sheriff's Office.

The Sheriff's Office has implemented a new program in the County called the "Cop Stop Program." Stickers are placed in the windows of businesses and schools announcing that a Deputy will stop on a frequent basis to check on the business or school. This program helps us keep in touch with schools and businesses so that we can address any needs they have. We like to be seen in the hallways of our schools so that students and staff know that we are around and are checking on their welfare.
