MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

– The thing that makes Hyrum the best place to live are the people who live here! I'm impressed how our community comes together to help when someone is in need. Recent fundraisers to help with medical costs are an example of the support citizens and neighbors give one another. I am amazed at the time volunteered by our citizens. We recently had our Comcast Cares Day of Service where 700 participated in projects within our city. The weather was less than favorable and many were soaked and covered in mud. It is amazing what we can accomplish when we work together. Thank you to all who participated and to Comcast for sponsoring this event.

New things are on the horizon in our city. JBS Swift will soon begin a large expansion of their plant which is planned to be completed in 2016 and provide 100 new jobs. An assisted living center and retirement complex is being built on the east end of Main Street. We are thrilled to have the Child and Family Support Center locate an office in our community. The Salt Hollow Park is near completion and we have started on the Blacksmith Fork Park. We received a grant to make improvements on our Senior Center.

We are beginning plans to rebuild the city offices. We had a building and engineering firm look at our current building and give us a price on doing a remodel versus rebuilding. The office building was built in the late 1960's and does not meet a lot of current building codes. We have problems with the roof, the electrical wiring, energy efficiency and limited office space. Our current building does not meet ADA standards causing accessibility issues at our elections and public meetings. The recommendation was to rebuild. When you start a remodel you are required to bring everything up to code and the cost of doing that with the current building is not cost efficient. We are looking at a modest efficient design that should have ample room for many years to come. We have put aside money and will not need to take out a bond. The Civic Center will remain and will not be affected by the new construction. We'll update you when we have more details.

A NOTE FROM YOUR STAR DEPUTIES – Starting May 13th Utah will have a handheld ban while driving. The new law bans us from using a cellphone or laptop to send texts, emails or instant messages. You cannot dial phone numbers, access the web, take or view pictures or video, or enter data into your mobile device while driving. You are able to use your cellphone and other devices using voice operated technology or Bluetooth. You can still dial your phone with your hands when you are reporting a medical emergency, reporting a safety hazard or reporting criminal activity. On the job law enforcement and medical personnel are allowed to use their hands.
