MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR – Hyrum City provides utility services to our community. We tend to take for granted the conveniences we have until we don't have them.

We turn on the faucet and water comes out. We don't think about how it gets there. Hyrum maintains 80 miles of water mains. Our water comes from 4 springs. We have 4 wells we are able to turn on if we need additional water. We have 3 Reservoirs that contain 5 million gallons of culinary water.

We send our waste water down the pipe not even thinking about where it goes. Hyrum maintains 46.3 miles of sewer lines that take wastewater collection to a mechanical treatment plant. Once the water is treated and released it is clean and clear. During the summer months we are able to recycle 1 million gallons of treated water daily back into our pressurized irrigation system for reuse.

We turn on a light switch not thinking of what happens to get the electricity there. Hyrum maintains 76 miles of distribution lines. We get our power from 8 different sources that come to three substations located in the city.

We provide pressurized irrigation to 2,099 connections and maintain 39.8 miles of distribution lines. We also have 2,370 storm water connections.

There is a lot that happens to bring those services to your home that you don't have to think about daily. When something happens that interrupts those services, we are fortunate to have trained and skilled employees that respond quickly to resolve the problem. Sometimes the problem requires some extensive work that may take a little longer. Thank you for your patience as we work to restore the service when it is out.

Here's a question I'll answer for you next month: How many parks does Hyrum City own and maintain?

A NOTE FROM YOUR STAR DEPUTIES – 41-6a-1002. Pedestrians' right-of-way -- Duty of pedestrian.

(1) (a) Except as provided under Subsection (2), when traffic-control signals are not in place or not in operation, the operator of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way by slowing down or stopping if necessary:

(i) to a pedestrian crossing the roadway within a crosswalk when the pedestrian is on the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling; or

(ii) when the pedestrian is approaching so closely from the opposite half of the roadway as to be in danger.

(b) Subsection (1)(a) does not apply under conditions of Subsection 41-6a-1003(2).

(c) A pedestrian may not suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which is so close as to constitute an immediate hazard.

(2) The operator of a vehicle approaching a school crosswalk shall come to a complete stop at the school crosswalk if:

(a) a school speed limit sign has the warning lights operating; and

(b) the crosswalk is occupied by a person.

(3) If a vehicle is stopped at a marked crosswalk or at any unmarked crosswalk at an intersection to permit a pedestrian to cross the roadway, the operator of any other vehicle approaching from the rear may not overtake and pass the stopped vehicle.
