City Council Meeting Summary – -A public hearing was held to receive public comment regarding the proposal of the creation of a local water district, considering the proposed 2016-2017 city budget, and for the proposed annexation filed by Kilgore Companies (aka Legrand Johnson Construction).

-A request for a home occupation business license was approved for Steven McKee, 160 South 400 East for making and repairing leather goods.

- Site plan approval was given to Marianne Hulse for dance studio at 40 West 300 North.

- Discussion with Kilgore Company was had to discuss conditions and requirements to be included in the annexation agreement.

- Final plat approval was given for Phase 3 of Rolling Hills Subdivision at approximately 400 East 450 South.

- Resolutions were passed accepting a petition for annexation of certain real property for property behind the Kendrick Phillips 66 and Knight Storage.

- Resolutions approving and adopting the Fiscal 2016-2017 operating budget, establishing the municipal certified tax rate for fiscal 2016-2017 (no increase), setting culinary water rates, and to provide for adjustments in the salaries of officers and employees of Hyrum City were approved.

- Delinquent utility accounts that were deemed to be uncollectable were written off by the council.

The information for this city newsletter is required a month before it is printed. Therefore the August council meeting hasn't taken place at the time this summary is composed.


