City Council Meeting Summary – The City Council meets on the first and third Thursdays of each month. City Council Meetings begin at 6:30 p.m. and are located in the Hyrum City Council Chambers in the basement of the Hyrum City Office Building.

Home occupation business licenses were approved for Rachel Reilly for application of permanent make-up at 142 North 500 West as well as Jessi McKee for application of permanent make-up at 125 West 300 North.

Ordinance 16-07 was approved, amending the Municipal Zoning Map and annexing 1.56 acres into the Corporate Limits of Hyrum City (Kendrick/Thornley Annexation).

A bid was accepted for the storm water project for the Hyrum City Office & Library parking lot.

The information for this city newsletter is required a month before it is printed. Therefore the November council meeting hasn't taken place at the time this summary is composed.

Winter Parking Restrictions – Winter parking restriction begin November 1st. Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.

Logan City Environmental Department - The Logan City Environmental Department has been performing studies to help us better understand recycling contamination in hopes of better combating the problem. Our current recycling contamination rate is 18% and we would like to see lower contamination rates - around 10-12%. This past summer, employees looked in cans to identify contaminants. Approximately 33% of the cans we looked in had zero contamination! However, in cans that had contamination present, nearly 87% of the contamination is one of these 7 items: Plastic Bags, Food Wrappers, Tissue, Styrofoam, Plastic without the Recycling Symbol, Pizza Boxes, or Disposable Dishware. We ask that Cache County residents do not place these items in their blue curbside recycling container. Attached is a graphic that shows you what can be recycled, along with some of the items we commonly see in recycling cans that should not be placed in the can!
