Mayors Message – Occasionally I have the privilege of meeting with scouts to discuss citizenship in the community. One of the things we talk about is the services Hyrum City provides that are funded by tax payers.

Hyrum receives 14% of collected money paid in your property tax. Based on the 2016-17 budget it is averaged an estimate of \$152.31 per home. Hyrum City provides approximately \$1,527.12 worth of General Fund services to each home, not including solid waste collection or utility services. This means that \$1,374.81 of those services must come from sources other than property tax.

The following are some of the services provided by tax payer funds: fire, police, snow removal, library, animal control, parks, recreation programs, spring cleanup, school crossing guards, first responders, senior citizen center, museum, cemetery, sidewalks, roads and city celebrations.

City Council Meeting Summary – *An audit report was given by Fred Burr from Wiggins & Associates.

*Final Plat approval was given for Little Bear Creek Subdivision, located at approximately 225 North 600 West, consisting of 27 single family building lots.

*Ordinance 16-10, was approved permitting and setting design standards for self-storage units in Manufacturing Zones and omitting them in Commercial Zones.

*Resolution 16-30, was approved appointing Councilmember Paul James as Hyrum City's Representative to the Cache Mosquito Abatement District.

*Resolution 16-31, was approved which adopted the Hyrum City Square Pavilion, Salt Hollow Park Pavilion, Blacksmith Park Pavilion, and AJ's Park rental fee and deposit schedule.

*Resolution 16-32, was approved amending the personnel policies and procedure manual for Hyrum City to set travel and training per diem at the IRS meal standard allowance.

*Alice Ostermiller was approved to be appointed to the Hyrum Senior Board.

*Jana Bushman was approved to be appointed to the Hyrum Historic Commission.

The information for this city newsletter is required a month before it is printed. Therefore the February City Council Meeting hasn't taken place at the time this summary is composed.

Dog Licenses – Any dog(s) four (4) months or older is required to be licensed with Hyrum City. Dogs are required to be licensed even if they stay inside your home or never leave your yard. The license fees are as follows:

Neutered/Spayed dogs - \$12

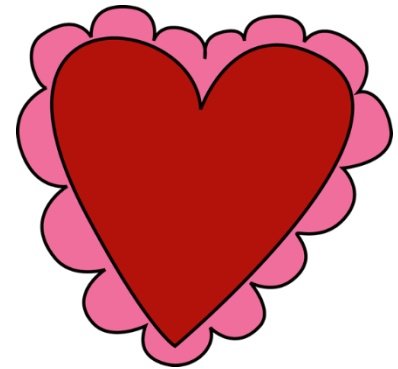
Male/Female dogs - \$22

A veterinarian certificate is required to verify rabies vaccination and the dog being neutered or spayed. All dogs must be licensed by Tuesday, February 28th. After February 28th a \$20 late fee will be assessed in addition to the regular license fee. Owners will be issued a citation for failure to have his/her dog properly licensed. Also, please remember that City Ordinance permits a maximum of **two dogs per household**.

Winter Parking Restrictions – Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.
