Mayors Message – Hyrum City has had a busy year: residential growth is increasing; some of our streets have been resurfaced and resealed; improvements have been made in our electrical system; improvements have been made at Blacksmith Park; many of the street trees have been trimmed; new trees have been planted; improvements were made to the Canyon Lodge; several storm water drainage projects have been completed; a drive-up ramp was added at the green waste bins; old steel water lines have been replaced on the east side of town; a pump station for the Little Feeder canal was installed to benefit our pressurized irrigation system; plans are underway for the trail to connect Hammer Road to the Blacksmith Fork Trail to be built along Hwy 101 next spring and summer; and the museum expansion was completed. The Hyrum City Youth Council donated several thousands of hours of service to our community. We had a great 4th of July Celebration, Easter Egg Hunts, Summer Reading Program, Hot Wheels & Hot Dogs, Fall Festival, Senior Center Events, Museum Events, and much more.

We enjoy living here because our citizens are involved and we have dedicated Hyrum City Employees and City Council who are committed to their jobs. I thank all of you for the contributions you make to make Hyrum City a great place to live that we all call "home."

*Friend Weller requested the city transfer its FCC radio frequency to a non-profit agency.

*Preliminary Plat approval was given for Phase IV of Rolling Hills Subdivision which consists of 16 single family lots located at approximately 550 South 400 East.

*The council approved sewer rates for assisted living centers.

*The High Line Canal Connection Project Bid was awarded to Johnson's Construction.

Winter Parking Restrictions – Winter parking restriction begin November 1st. Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.
